"DAY OF SHOW" ENTRIES MUST BE IN NO LATER THAN 9: 00 AM. Judging to start at approximately 10:00 AM, or as soon as day of show entries are completed.

The class schedule will not be final until all Day of Show entries are in on the day of the show.

Pre-Registered (Email) - \$ 3.00 per animal, regardless of breed, type, class, or size.

Day of Show Entries: - \$ 4.00 per animal, regardless of breed, type, class, or size.

REGISTRATION: Phone entries will not be accepted. Day of show entries will be accepted for a \$1.00 extra per class / per animal fee. Day of show entries must be in showroom and registered by 9:00 AM to be eligible to show animals at this show. There will be a \$1.00 fee for day of show substitutions. Substitution animals must be the same breed and class.

All returned checks will be subject to a \$ 40.00 insufficient funds fee.

SCRATCHES on Day of Show: NO REFUNDS; NO EXCEPTIONS

REFRESHMENTS: Due to COVID-19, there be a limited food menu available for purchase for breakfast and lunch. A limited amount of beverages will be available for purchase.

This is a 4-H show, limited to exhibitors who fall within the ages of 4-H rules. All exhibits will be shown by the 4-H member, or handler of 4-H age. No changes of ownership will be accepted after initial registration, and you must have owned the animal you are showing in breed classes for at least 30 days. You need not own the animal used for Rabbit or Cavy Showmanship.

Cloverbud (Prep) Showmanship Entries: Kindergarten-3rd Grade – Participation ribbon and Judges comments only – There is NO CHARGE for Cloverbud (Prep) Showmanship

Junior Showmanship Entries: Grades 4-6 Intermediate Showmanship Entries: Grades 7-9 Senior Showmanship Entries: Grades 10-13

This is a box show. No cages will be provided, so you need to bring your own cage(s). Carrying cages must have leak proof bottoms. All animals will be carried to and from the judging table by the 4-H member or handler of 4-H age. 4-H members can help other 4-H members or other young exhibitors. Exhibitors are responsible for being at the show table at the proper time.

Rabbits must be earmarked with their tag # in the left ear with black ink. Cavies will have their tag # taped to their left ear if they are not permanently tagged. Small animals will have their coop # taped to their cage. If more than one (1) small animal is in the cage, the 4-H member or exhibitor must be with the animals/cage to identify them to the judge.

The attached animal health form should accompany you and your animals to the show. Diseased stock will be removed from the showroom immediately! Please evaluate your animal carefully prior to arriving at the show and be certain to check animals for colds, ear canker, mites, fleas, and any other health flaws. NO REFUNDS if your animal does not pass health check!

Smoking is not permitted in the building. We assume no loss in case of fire, theft, or permanent destruction. Every precaution will be taken to insure safety and prevent loss. Parents will be responsible for their children's behavior. We expect the premises to be respected. Be courteous of one another and share space in the showroom. Please try to social distance when possible.

Special events: Silent auction table. Any donation of an animal to the silent auction table must be approved by the show committee and come with a food dish, water bottle, box, and completed form with the animal's pertinent information (see attached form). Any animals not claimed from the silent auction will be returned to the donor. Additional silent auction items and baskets - other than animals, will be also be available for bid. Cash only for winning bidder payment.

Awards: Awards will be presented to the Best in Show – Rabbit, Best in Show - Cavy, and Best in Show - Small Animal. Awards will be presented to the Reserve Best in Show - Rabbit, Reserve Best in Show - Cavy, and Reserve Best in Show - Small Animal.

Showmanship awards will be given to the top two (2) place winners in Junior, Intermediate, and Senior Showmanship – for first-year, second-year, and open (3 Years or More) showmanship!

Best of Breed and Reserve Best of Breed awards will be awarded to each best of breed rabbit and cavy, when the breed is represented by at least **three** (3) different exhibits.

Danish ribbons to all exhibits: excellent, very good, good. Clover Bud (Prep) entries are non-competitive and are not judged. Clover Bud (Prep) members and open exhibitors of prep age will receive only judge's comments and a participation ribbon.

Judging will be by breed standards. There will be no judging for Best of Variety. There will be no judging for Best of Class. Decisions of the judges are final.

"OVER THE HILL" – For animals that are well past their prime for breed showing (OLD – meaning, that they have past their prime for breed showing, but your pet is well-loved and still deserves to be on the show table at their advanced age. (Registration Fees apply – Rabbit and Cavy only)

- 1. Travel Route 78 West merge into Route 287 South (Somerville),
- 2. Travel Route 287 South onto Route 202/206 South (202 & 206 will split),
- 3. Merge onto Route 202 South (Flemington) (202 goes over the Somerville Circle),
- 4. Travel route 202 South (about 3 miles), Note: Railroad overpass, "4-H is TOPS" sign, on overpass.
- 5. Turn right at Milltown Road (before light),

From East:


- 1. Travel Route 287 North,
